Administration update . . .

- A new audio system was purchased for the Boardroom and is completely portable for use at future District events.

Water Operations update...

- The valve and hydrant maintenance program continues with 75% completed, two hydrants on Bluegrass were not functioning. Staff has made these repairs from spare parts and both are operational.
- We had an emergency leak on 9/12 due to an in-ground valve leaking. Staff made a temporary repair at the time and a new valve was installed the following week.
- The District is required by California Dept. of Public Health to take lead and copper samples every 3 years. Staff distributed sample bottles with instructions and participants were given a \$15.00 voucher. This sampling is not reflective of the water quality in the distribution system. Thank you to our customers who participated in this testing.
