Helendale Thrift Store

Did you know you can bring the following items to the Helendale Thrift Store during regular business hours:

- Mattresses - must be covered with plastic bag (bags are available for purchase at the CSD)
- Electronic Waste - TV's, computers, vacuums, coffee pots, printers, etc.
- Green Waste - some exclusions apply, green waste cannot be bagged
- Cardboard - must be broken down

The Thrift Store will also pick up your resellable items at no cost. To make an appointment, please call 760-952-1941.

If you have large items that are not resellable, you can contact the office at 760-951-0006 for a bulky item pick-up. Customers can get up to 5 items picked up twice a year.

Conservation Corner

In the average home, showers are typically the third largest water user after toilets and clothes washers. On average Americans shower about 8 minutes and uses almost 18 gallons of water at an average flow rate of 2.2 gallons per minute. An easy way to save water in your home is by replacing your old shower head with a new low flow one.

Another great way to save water is to take shorter showers. Depending on your showerheads flow rate you could save anywhere from 1.5 to 2.5 gallons or more for every minute of reduced shower time.

Stop by the CSD office, Monday through Friday from 8:00 am – 5:30 pm and pick up a FREE water efficient 1.75 gpm shower head. Compared to a 2.2 gpm shower head you will be saving .45 gpm – that's a savings of 3.6 gallons for every 8-minute shower, that's a savings of over 1,300 gallons per year! *Shower heads available while supplies last.*



April Watering Times: Between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm. Test run your irrigation system to check for leaks and spray heads that are broken or out of adjustment. Reset irrigation schedules and increase watering time as temperatures rise.
